I. HIGHLIGHTS

- Cambodia is globally renowned for its awe-inspiring temples, but it offers much more than iconic architecture.

- Explore the diverse tapestry of Cambodia by visiting the filming locations of movies such as First They Killed My Father, The Creator, City of Ghosts, 2 Brothers, and the iconic Tomb Raider.

II. ITINERARY

DAY 1

PHNOM PENH - ARRIVAL

Depending on the arrival time tour by Cyclo through the Old French Quarter (scenes of City of Ghosts had been shot here) and the Central Market (City of Ghosts). If time permits, you can visit the Royal Palace with the Silver Pagoda, and the National Museum.

Overnight in PHNOM PENH

DAY 2

PHNOM PENH – TAKEO – BOKOR NATIONAL PARK

In the morning, visit the S-21 Toul Sleng Museum and the Killing Fields. While no films were shot here, the site holds a connection to the movie The Killing Fields. Afterward, head south to explore Phnom Chisor, a location featured in City of Ghosts, before continuing on to Kampot, another iconic filming spot from the same movie.

DAY 3

BOKOR NATIONAL PARK – PHNOM PENH

Excursion to Bokor Hill. See the former French Casino (now a hotel), the old Catholic Church, and Wat Sampov Pram (City of Ghosts). Return overland to Phnom Penh.

DAY 4

PHNOM PENH - BATTAMBANG

Travel overland to Battambang. Visit in the afternoon the Wat Sampov with the Pagodas and the “Killing Cave” (Khmer Rouge time) and the Phnom Banan with the Wat Banan. Ride with the rustic Bamboo Train.

DAY 5

BATTAMBANG

A tour through the Old Town of Battambang. The streets here were used as the setting of Phnom Penh in “First they killed my father” to resemble Phnom Penh at this time. You will see buildings from outside which were used as the family home in the movie, as office etc. (not possible to see from inside, as these are schools, shops etc.).

In the afternoon a tour by Tuk Tuk in the villages adjacent to Battambang City with the visit of local houses with small home productions of rice paper, sticky rice, rice wine etc. Many of these families here survived the Khmer Rouge time. Also, a visit to the Wat Samrong, another Killing Field with a touching Memorial Site.

DAY 6

BATTAMBANG – SIEM REAP

Overland to Siem Reap. After arrival, continue towards the East of the city to visit the Floating Village of Kampong Phluk (The Creator).

The great Tonle Sap Lake is the richest freshwater fishing ground in the world, a national treasure producing an ever-changing landscape. The communities that live around the margins of the lake cope with huge seasonal variations in water levels by building their homes on floating bamboo rafts. It is well worth the extra effort to visit a Floating Village for an understanding of contemporary lake life. Take the opportunity to pause at the stilted and floating houses to see and learn how a subsistence fishing family lives.

DAY 7

SIEM REAP

Today, embark on a private Tuk Tuk journey to explore the majestic Angkor Wat, Angkor Thom, and Ta Prohm, featured in movies such as Tomb Raider, The Creator, and 2 Brothers.

Begin by visiting the Southern Gate of Angkor Thom (the 'Great City'), home to some of the finest temples built by King Jayavarman VII (reigned 1181–1220). Marvel at the imposing 23-meter (75-foot) high stone faces of Avalokiteshvara, which were prominently featured in Tomb Raider. These awe-inspiring carvings leave an unforgettable impression on all who see them. At the heart of the citadel lies Bayon Temple, a 12th-century temple-mountain adorned with hundreds of colossal stone faces. Your tour will also include the Terrace of Elephants and the Terrace of the Leper King. Later, discover the Baphuon and Phimeanakas, some of the most famous 11th-century temples.

Next, visit Ta Prohm, known for the massive trees whose thick roots have intertwined with the temple walls. These trees were intentionally left by archaeologists to preserve the original site's appearance, showcasing nature reclaiming the ruins. The towering trees that have grown around and through the temple ruins are truly unforgettable. Conclude your day with a visit to the magnificent Angkor Wat, built under King Suryavarman II.

DAY 8

SIEM REAP

In the morning there was an excursion to Phnom Kulen (Tomb Raider and 2 Brothers) and afterwards the temple Banteay Srei Temple.

In the morning visit Phnom Kulen, which is a sacred hilltop site 30km (18 miles) from Angkor Wat in Cambodia and is widely regarded as the birthplace of the ancient Khmer Empire. Of special religious meaning to Hindus and Buddhists, it was at Phnom Kulen that King Jayavarman II proclaimed independence from Java in 802 A.D.

Buddhists co-opted Phnom Kulen as a holy site of their own after the Hindu heyday. Ang Thom is a 16th-century Buddhist monastery notable for the giant reclining Buddha carved into the top of a 20m (65-foot) boulder. Climb the rickety wooden staircase to a landing that surrounds the 17m-long (55 feet) Buddha, where monks and believers bow, burn incense and leave fruit.

Continue to Banteay Srei.

Today we enjoy an excursion to Banteay Srei, a temple that dates back to 967 AD. The temple is dedicated to the Hindu god Shiva and is famed for its intricate friezes carved into its red sandstone walls. On the return – if time permits - we will visit Banteay Samre, built during Suryavarman II's rule in the middle of the 12th century.

DAY 9

SIEM REAP - DEPARTURE

In the morning visit Boeng Mealea (Suryavarman II, 1113-1150) a temple surrounded by jungle and was featured in the movie 2 Brothers.

Boeng Mealea is a temple in the Angkor Wat style located 60 km east of the main group of temples at Angkor by road. It is largely unrestored, with trees and thick brush thriving amidst its towers and courtyards and many of its stones lying in great heaps. In the afternoon transfer to the airport for your departure flight.
