## I. HIGHLIGHTS

- Discover the awe-inspiring UNESCO World Heritage Site, including Angkor Wat, Angkor Thom, and Ta Prohm, with detailed guided tours.
- Experience life on the water with a boat trip to Kampong Phluk, a floating village offering insight into Cambodia's unique river culture.
- Travel overland through the Cambodian countryside, stopping at local communities and Silk Island to witness traditional crafts.
- Enjoy a traditional Khmer dinner accompanied by a captivating Apsara dance performance, celebrating the country's rich heritage.

## II. ITINERARY

### DAY 1

### ARRIVAL PHNOM PENH

Upon arrival at Phnom Penh International Airport, you will be welcomed by your local guide and transferred to your selected hotel for check-in.

The remainder of the day is at leisure to relax or explore the city at your own pace.

### DAY 2

### PHNOM PENH

Begin your day with a half-day city tour by cyclo (traditional bicycle rickshaw), offering a unique perspective of Phnom Penh's cultural landmarks. Visit the National Museum, showcasing ancient Khmer artifacts, followed by the Royal Palace and the Silver Pagoda, celebrated for their ornate architecture and historical significance. Conclude the morning at Wat Phnom, the city's spiritual heart, and enjoy a bit of shopping at the bustling Central Market, known for its art-deco design.

Cambodia Cyclo Association: This NGO supports cyclo drivers by offering medical care, life skills training, and community support to improve their livelihoods.

In the afternoon, embark on a 3-hour Architecture Tour focused on Phnom Penh's New Khmer Architecture movement of the 1960s. Led by Cambodian architects or students, the tour explores key landmarks designed by renowned architect Vann Molyvann, including the Royal

University of Phnom Penh, the 100 Houses Project, and the National Sports Complex (Olympic Stadium).

Transport is by tuk-tuk (air-conditioned vehicles available upon request at an additional cost).

KA-Tours: This non-profit organization, now part of Space for Architects Cambodia, is dedicated to preserving the city's architectural heritage.

### DAY 3

## PHNOM PENH

### *BEAR CARE TOUR (SIC)*

Today you'll join a shared Bear Care Tour at Phnom Tamao Wildlife Rescue Centre, home to bears rescued from the illegal wildlife trade. Learn about the conservation efforts of Free the Bears and assist the Bear Care Team by helping prepare enrichment toys and treats.

After a traditional Khmer lunch (vegetarian options available), enjoy a guided exploration of the wildlife center. End the experience by helping to hide food in the bears' forest enclosures, observing their natural behaviors.

Important Note: No direct contact with the bears is allowed. Please wear closed shoes and comfortable clothing suitable for a day in the forest.

Transfers are arranged from a central meeting point in Phnom Penh.

### DAY 4

## SIEM REAP & VISIT HERORATS

This morning, travel by public coach to Siem Reap, a journey of approximately 6 hours. The bus will make a stop halfway for a quick lunch in a local restaurant.

Upon arrival, transfer to your selected hotel.

In the late afternoon, visit the APOPO HeroRATs Visitor Center. Learn how trained African giant pouched rats help detect landmines in Cambodia. During a guided tour, discover the history of landmines in the region, observe a live demonstration, and gain insights into this life-saving work.

### DAY 5

## SIEM REAP

### *Full-Day Angkor Discovery with Apsara Dinner Show*

Spend the day immersed in the grandeur of Angkor's ancient temples. Begin with a visit to the

iconic Angkor Wat, admired for its intricate bas-reliefs and soaring towers. Continue to the walled city of Angkor Thom, where you'll explore the enigmatic Bayon Temple with its giant stone faces, and see the Royal Enclosure, Phimeanakas, and the Terraces of the Elephants and Leper King.

After lunch at a local restaurant, head to the mysterious Ta Prohm, a temple partially reclaimed by nature, its ruins entwined with massive tree roots, offering a unique and atmospheric experience.

This evening, enjoy a Khmer set dinner at a traditional restaurant while watching a graceful Apsara Dance performance, a classical art form dating back to the Angkorian era.

## DAY 6

### SIEM REAP

This morning, hop aboard a tuk-tuk for a half-day excursion to Tonlé Sap Lake and the stilted village of Kampong Phluk. Cruise through its scenic waterways and take a small paddle boat through a tranquil flooded mangrove forest.

Enjoy an authentic ox-cart ride and visit a local market, followed by the ancient temples of the Roluos Group – Bakong, Preah Ko, and Lolei – which mark the beginnings of Angkorian temple architecture.

In the evening, experience the vibrant Phare Circus, where talented young performers blend theater, music, dance, and acrobatics to share Cambodian stories.

Note: No animals are used in Phare performances.

## DAY 7

### SIEM REAP

Today you will join a join-in group tour to the Cambodia Wildlife Sanctuary, located roughly two hours from Siem Reap. This sanctuary is home to rescued elephants and other wildlife living freely in their natural habitat. This is a no-riding, no-touching, ethical sanctuary that focuses on observation and education.

Itinerary breakdown:

- 08:00 – 08:30: Pickup from your hotel in Siem Reap
- 10:00 – 10:30: Arrival at Cambodia Wildlife Sanctuary
- 10:30 – 12:00: Meet some of the rescued female elephants in the jungle, admiring them from a close but respectful distance. Observe their natural behavior as they forage on vegetation, drink from waterholes, and enjoy a mud bath.
- 12:00 – 13:00: Delicious vegan buffet lunch served at the sanctuary
- 13:00 – 15:00: Visit other elephants in their jungle home. Learn more about their backgrounds and habits from the sanctuary guides.

- 15:00 – 15:45: Assist in preparing food for the elephants and monkeys, followed by feeding time.
- 15:45 – 16:00: Depart the sanctuary and return to Siem Reap

What to bring:

Camera, sun protection (hat, sunscreen, sunglasses), insect repellent, comfortable clothes and walking shoes.

Note: Interaction with the elephants is not permitted — visitors may only observe from a respectful distance while the animals enjoy their natural behaviors. This join-in tour requires a minimum of 2 participants to operate.
